CLAUDIA DIAMOND (President)

Claudia has agreed to serve a second consecutive year as Civic League President after several years on the Roland Park Community Foundation Board of Trustees. We benefit from her experience on numerous other local boards including the Women's Law Center, the Women's Housing Coalition and Samuel Ready Scholarships.
