# 1. Routine Business

In our Community! Welcome	President Diamond introduced Dr David Wilson.
Dr. David Wilson, President, Morgan State	Dr. David Wilson provided updates on ongoing updates at Morgan State University.
	Vision: premier public urban research university in Maryland – every city of comparable size has a similar institution.
	Initiatives: drive pride and ownership through celebrating school colors and building landmarks like the Legacy Bridge; Retention and Graduation rates started around 65% and currently have 11 straight years of %70+ retention rates for the first time; won 3 national awards including a significant number of first generation college students; largest incoming freshman class and largest total enrollment ever in the most recent class – fastest growing public university in the state of Maryland; majority of incoming freshman are from out of state and 70+ countries are represented; #1 in awarded degrees to Black students in Maryland across several industries/domains; #1 in the nation in electrical engineering, civil engineering, and other engineering degrees.
	Future Vision: continue to evolve the institution, building on success and ascend to a premier global research institution that serves as an anchor institution in Baltimore; example of anchoring community: upgrades the Northwood Commons shopping center.
	School is in the process of a \$1.1B transformation of the university campus; new school of business and management, behavioral, social sciences building; health and human sciences, and others; state provisioned \$200M for new buildings.
	Dr. Wilson fielded questions from the audience.
	President Diamond asked if there are opportunities for our neighbors to support the school and its students; answer: Yes!; including mentorship and contributions to the food pantry on the campus.
Welcome new Office Manager	President Diamond introduced our new RPCL Office Manager, Kristina Strakna.

Welcome Councilwomen The Councilwomen addressed the audience on the current water issue in West Sharon Middleton & Odette Baltimore; the Roland Park has not impacted; there are opportunities for Ramos volunteerism to hand out water; the councilwomen are in communication with the city offices to be abreast of the latest information and indicate that they will disseminate accordingly; investigations are undergoing. The Councilwomen debriefed the community on the 4<sup>th</sup> of July Parade and the incident where a child was hit by motor vehicle; Captain Jenkins of BPD and DOT representatives were contacted and indicate customer service and other sessions are being held to ensure a similar issue does not happen in the future; additionally, there were some issues with the permitting department that led to communication and coverage gaps; all parties acknowledge that events need to have proper coverage before they proceed and in the future, safety should preclude any community event. The shopping center area is being evaluated on how to deal with sewage grease; a pipe needs to be upsized to address the root cause of the issue; ongoing realtime fixes happen when the situation arises but permanent fix is forthcoming. For recurring or one-time issues, please continue to reach out to 311. Speed hump requests have been placed for several streets; curved roads cause some issues; the city only has 1 engineer which creates a backlog and delay. Some instances of deer control challenges; new contact in Forestry – Dan Coy. Roland Water Tower – tower is open, and falcons have returned and had babies!; the determination of whether the road should be closed or whether the area should be turned into a park is ongoing; there have been neighborhoods concerned with the process and access challenges which will be revisited to ensure all stakeholders are taken into account in decision making. Work is ongoing to revisit zoning rules. University Pwky is getting repaved and narrowed and will take several weeks Mervo High School is grieving a recent tragedy; there is a volunteer opportunity to support the school community and shower students and faculty with positivity; information is on the Mervo website. Recognition of Julie Johnson, President Diamond acknowledged Julie Johnson's service and tenure at the **Enoch Pratt Library** Enoch Pratt Library (21 years). David Blumberg and other neighbors shared remarks on Ms. Johnson and thanked her for her tireless and gracious service to our community. Approval of June Minutes Minutes from the June meeting were approved by the board. **September Socials** Will be hosted throughout the fall; hosted by Plat representatives.
