In our Community! RPCL at Live Baltimore "Trolley Tour" event	President Diamond shared that Rachel Dawson has been coordinating with Live Baltimore and hosted a table to share information and promote city living. More volunteer opportunities of this nature will be available in the future.	
Annual Meeting date and speaker	Hosted on May 3 rd ; Mayor Scott will be guest speaker; RPEMS multipurpose room will be the location.	
Treasurer's Report	RPCL Treasurer was not able to attend to present his report	
City agency liaison reports	Anthony Greene (DPW) attended and discussed two key DPW initiatives: 1) Paperless Billing is a big push to be green and efficient 2) several ongoing efforts to manage rising water bills — Water for All provides federal funds for water billing support and other state initiatives such as Pay as You Go; visit their websites for information; No interim DPW Director has identified Eric James (DPT) our Department of Transportation liaison. Signage has been put up to address pedestrian issues at Deepdene and Wyndhurst. Kathy Hudson asked Mr. James about the 1 purple light put in recently who suggested he would investigate and inquire	
Report on Fire Station Staffing	Michelle Pasternack shared a report she prepared discussing shortages in fire and medic staffing in Roland Park and across the city which results in delayed response times and degraded working conditions.	
	The fire team asked for Roland Park neighbors to engage our local council members to address budgetary concerns to make the community safer. President Diamond reached out to the Fire Department and discussed some of the issues referenced in the aforementioned report and was informed some of the items were being addressed, some of the shortages will be addressed in upcoming Fire Department recruitment classes, and others remain open.	
	An invitation has been extended to the fire chief and the firemen to join the March RPCL to discuss some of these issues. President Diamond will reach out to councilwoman Ramos to attend with the intent to have a engaged discussion about the current state and how the community can provide support and impact.	

Update on New Business in old Evergreen Café location	Matthew Mulcahy – Keswick Assoc. and Finn Lepski – Evergreen Assoc. attended to discuss conversations with Binod Uprety about the plans for the new restaurant and how to manage each party's interest in relation to operating hours and liquor licenses.
	The two associations have developed an MOU for an understanding between the two/three neighborhood associations for the Evergreen space and the laundromat. The intent is to have alignment between the communities and Mr. Uprety with RPCL sharing their support.
	The group discussed the mechanics and the levers that are available to influence the liquor licensing process.
	The group discussed supporting the draft MOU and agreeing to collaborate on any formal drafting MOU between the three groups. RPCL board will need to vote and approve any formal draft that may be presented and approved. The draft MOU will have language changed to present the three
	associations together as determined by the board.
