CLAUDIA DIAMOND (President)

Claudia has agreed to serve a third and final term as Civic League President. Prior to taking the helm at the Civic League, Claudia spent several years on the Roland Park Community Foundation Board of Trustees. We benefit from her experience on numerous other local boards including the Women's Law Center, the Women's Housing Coalition and Samuel Ready Scholarships. A University of Baltimore Law School graduate, she's now their Assistant Dean for Writing & Advocacy.
